THE SEASON AFTER EPIPHANY

This period, which begins the day after the Octave of Epiphany, is an extension of Christmastide. Jesus asserts His Divinity...not by the appearance of angels or the star of the Magi, but speaking Himself as God. He subjects our hearts to His teachings, explaining His divine doctrine with parables and manifesting the truth of His words and works of many miracles.

THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

When Jesus submitted himself for Baptism, John the Baptist balked, saying that it was Christ who should baptize him, but Jesus answered, "Let it be now; for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness."

– Matthew 3;15 It is telling that Jesus began his public ministry with such a humble act. Time and again Jesus does the will of the Father, culminating in the Garden of Gethsemane, when he prays, "not my will, but thine, be done." – Luke 22;42

John the Baptist is an instrument of God and Jesus submits, not to John, but to God. So it is today. We will not always like or "get along" with other people in our parish, family, or neighborhood, but that is of no matter. We are always fulfilling the will of our Father, no matter the circumstances. We are called to Stewardship, we are called to sharing and giving. We are not called to judging or deciding the worthiness of the people we encounter.

Many voices ask for our attention. There is a voice that says, "Prove that you are a good person." Another voice says, "You'd better be ashamed of yourself."
