READING I - Mal 1:14b-2:2b, 8-10

A great King am I, says the LORD of hosts, and my name will be feared among the nations. And now, O priests, this commandment is for you: If you do not listen, if you do not lay it to heart, to give glory to my name, says the LORD of hosts, I will send a curse upon you and of your blessing I will make a curse. They tie up heavy burdens hard to carry and lay them on people's shoulders, but they will not lift a finger to move them. All their works are performed to be seen. They widen their phylacteries and lengthen their tassels. They love places of honor at banquets, seats of honor in synagogues, greetings in marketplaces, and the salutation 'Rabbi.' As for you, do not be called 'Rabbi.' You have but one teacher, and you are all brothers. Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven. Do not be called 'Master'; you have but one master, the Christ. The greatest among you must be your servant. Whoever exalts

ST. MARTIN DE PORRES

(1579-1639)

His feast day is November 3rd. St. Martin was born at Lima, Peru, on November 9, 1579. He was the illegitimate son of a prominent Spanish colonist, John de Porres, and a poor black woman, Anna Velasquez. For some years his father refused to recognize him as his son, and so Martin shared his mother's poverty. After eight vears, the father accepted Martin and provided for his education. With skills as pharmacist, doctor and surgeon, the youth began to work for the poor of his city. He asked to be admitted as a Dominican lay-helper at Rosary Convent in Lima. Eventually his community, impressed with his life of prayer and service, asked him to become a full member in 1594. He helped establish an orphanage and foundling hospital and spent much of his time caring for the black slaves brought to Peru from Africa. Martin re-

mained for the rest of his life—devoted servant of the poor, caring for their sick, treating them with dignity, reminding them of God's love for people of every race and color. Those who knew him called him a "loving father, a father of the poor." A close friend of St. Rose of Lima, Martin died at Rosary Convent in Lima on November 3, 1639. We pray, O God, you raise up those who are bowed down, Help the poor and distressed. Amen.
