THE STORY OF MEMORIAL DAY

Memorial Day is also called Decoration Day. It began two years after the Civil War, when some women of Columbus, Mississippi, decorated the graves of both Confederate and Union men. This was a well-received gesture in those sensitive times. The custom spread, and in May, 1868 General John A. Logan, commander-in-chief of the Grand Army of the Republic, made the practice official. He named May 30 as the day "for the purpose of strewing with flowers or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country." Today we use Memorial Day to remember not only soldiers but also other people who were important to us and have died.
