READING I - Acts 2:1-11

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem. At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language. They were astounded, and in amazement they asked, "Are not all these people who are speaking Galileans? Then how does each of us hear them in his native language? ST. BARNABAS (First Century) Apostle

His feast day is June 11. Though not one of the twelve apostles chosen by Jesus, St. Barnabas played an important role in the mission of the apostles to the Gentile world. He was a Jew of the tribe of Levi and was born at Cyprus. His name was Joseph, but was changed to Barnabas by the apostles. He was one of the first converts to Christianity at Jerusalem after Pentecost. The Acts of the Apostles describes him as Barnabas, "the Son of Encouragement," who "sold a field which belonged to him and brought the money and laid it at the apostles feet." "A good man, filled with the Holy Spirit and with faith," he was closely connected with St. Paul during his early mission journeys and introduced him to the apostles. As a founder of the Church at Antioch, Barnabas invited Paul from Tarsus to help him form the new community of Christians. Then, inspired by the Holy Spirit, Paul and Barnabas journeyed to other cities of Asia Minor, preaching the message of Jesus Christ. The two apostles brought money from the Church of Antioch for the relief of famine victims in Judea. Barnabas and Paul spoke at the Council of Jerusalem, describing the success of the Gospel among the Gentiles and winning approval for further journeys to the Gentile world. The two apostles came to disagreement in the course of their ministry over Barnabas' cousin John Mark, and separated. Barnabas and John Mark went to Cyprus, and Paul went to Syria. Eventually, they were reunited. There is nothing we know for certain of Barnabas' later activity and death, but it is thought that he was stoned to death in 61 at Salamis.

His prayer: Father, you sent St. Barnabas to convert the nations. Help us to proclaim your Gospel. Amen.

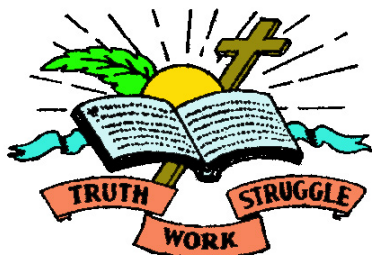

ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA

"Finder of lost objects" (c. 1195-1231)

His feast day is June 13th. A scholar, he was appointed to first lector in theology for the Franciscan Order. He was particularly devoted to the study of the Word of God and this devotion to Scripture shaped his preaching ministry. Miracles of conversion and healing during his early teaching shaped his reputation as a man of God. His love for the poor is expressed in the bread that is often associated with him in statuary and painting. Sometimes we see him holding a lily or an open book of Scripture suggesting his knowledge of God's Word. And sometimes he is seen holding the child Jesus indicating Anthony's humility and holiness of life. For some, he finds what we lose - perhaps your keys or your umbrella! His Feast day is occasion to thank God for his life and goodness and to pray that we may see his likes again, as well as to share our blessings with those who have been less fortunate. His prayer, Anthony, help me to remember what is most important in life. When I forget or lose sight of spiritual realities, let me find them, just as you have helped many people over the centuries find lost objects. Give me the grace and humility to accept my forgetfulness. Amen.
