
GOSPEL - Mark 12:28b-34

HALLOWEEN, Today, October 31

November 1st was set aside to honor **all saints**. It was called **All Hallows** or **All Saints Day**, and the evening before it was **All Hallows E'en**, which means **"holy evening."** Later this was short-



ened to **Halloween**. **Halloween** is now generally celebrated with fun-making and masquerading.

ALL SAINTS DAY & ALL SOULS DAY...

All Saints' Day is a solemn holy day of the Catholic Church celebrated annually on November 1. The day is dedicated to the saints of the Church, that is, all those who have attained heaven. It should not be confused with All Souls' Day, which is observed on November 2, and is dedicated to those who have died and not yet reached heaven.

Although millions, or even billions of people may already be saints, **All Saints' Day** observances tend to focus on known saints --that is those recognized in the canon of the saints by the Catholic Church.

All Saints' Day is also commemorated by members of the Eastern Orthodox Church as well as some protestant churches, such as Lutheran and Anglican churches.

Many **All Souls' Day** traditions are associated with popular notions about purgatory. Bell tolling is meant to comfort those being cleansed. Lighting candles serves to kindle a light for the poor souls languishing in the darkness. Soul cakes are given to children coming to sing or pray for the dead (cross reference, trick-or-treating), giving rise to the traditions of "going souling" and the baking of special types of bread or cakes.

In the Catholic Church, "the faithful" refers specifically to baptized Catholics; "all souls" commemorates the church penitent of souls in purgatory. In the liturgical books of the western Catholic Church, it is called the **Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed.** Catholics pray for the dead. The Church teaches that the purification of the souls in purgatory can be assisted by the actions of the faithful on earth. Its teaching is based also on the practice of prayer for the dead mentioned as far back as 2 Maccabees 12:42-46. In the West there is ample evidence of the custom of praying for the dead in the inscriptions of the catacombs, with their constant prayers for the peace of the souls of the departed. The doctrine that the souls which, on departing from the body, are not perfectly cleansed from venial sins, or have not fully atoned for past transgressions, are debarred from the Beatific Vision, and that the faithful on earth can help them by prayers, alms deeds and especially by the sacrifice of the Mass.
